Delaware Wins Award of Excellence for State Garden Clubs

TREE-mendous Delaware, a two-part project of Delaware Federation of Garden Clubs that emphasizes (1) membership growth and (2) tree planting at Delaware Botanic Gardens at Pepper Creek, was recognized with the Award of Excellence for State Garden Clubs by National Garden Clubs, Inc. at their May 2018 Conference in Philadelphia last week. Two new garden clubs were formed in Delaware since the project began in April 2017 (Coastal Gardeners and Four Seasons Gardeners of DFGC President Lisa Arni displays the medal Heritage Shores), increasing statewide that accompanied the Award of Excellence.



membership by nearly 10%, which was the two-year goal for this project. The Twenty-five Hundred Dollar first year goal for tree planting at Delaware Botanic Gardens at Pepper Creek was reached just six months after the project began. Over \$10,000 has been raised to date. These funds are used by Delaware Botanic Gardens to plant the Woodland Garden area next to the Meadow Garden.

Delaware Federation of Garden Clubs President Lisa Arni was extremely proud and equally stunned by the extraordinary awards earned by Delaware Garden Clubs from National Garden Clubs, Inc. MILFORD GARDEN CLUB


